Jesus replied, "The coming of the kingdom of God is not something that can be observed, nor will people say, 'Here it is,' or 'There it is,' because the kingdom of God is in your minds" (Luke 17:20-21).

As we look at the kingdom of God throughout the teachings of Jesus, we discover that it includes many important concepts including (but not limited to):

1. Spiritual Realm or Presence:

In some passages, it seems Jesus was referring to a spiritual or divine realm where God's sovereignty and rule are fully realized. In this view, the Kingdom of God is not a physical place, but rather a state of being where God's authority and principles are acknowledged and lived out in people's hearts and lives.

2. Social and Ethical Transformation:

Jesus often spoke about values such as love, compassion, forgiveness, and justice. The Kingdom of God can refer to a church that submits to God's rule so these values are upheld and practiced, resulting in transformed communities.

3. Future Eschatological Kingdom:

Some interpretations emphasize the future aspect of the Kingdom of God. This view suggests that the Kingdom will be fully realized at a later time, often associated with the Second Coming of Christ, when God's ultimate reign will be established on Earth.

4. Present Reality and Process:

Another perspective is that the Kingdom of God is both a future hope and a present reality. It's seen as a gradual process of God's reign unfolding in the world as people align themselves with God's will and values.

5. Personal Relationship with God:

Some interpretations focus on the idea that the Kingdom of God refers to an intimate and personal relationship with God. <u>It's about individuals entering into a close connection with the divine, experiencing God's presence, and living in accordance with God's teachings.</u>

Focus On Dr. Bill & Janis Erwin



Janis Erwin

I was born on Valentines Day, 1941, in Plainview, Texas. At that time, my Dad taught science at Plainview High School. When I was about a year old we moved to Washington, D.C., where Dad worked for the FBI during the war. We moved back to Plainview, where Dad taught at Wayland Baptist College and we lived in Matador Hall on campus where Mom was the House Mother. Then we moved to San Angelo, Quanah, and finally to Lubbock when I was in fifth grade. By that time, I had a brother and two sisters.

I remember very clearly when I first believed. My mother and I were cleaning house on the farm where we lived outside of Quanah. I remember asking my mother, "What does it mean to be a Christian?" I had been going to church since Cradle Roll, and Mother taught Sunday School and Daddy was a deacon. I've often imagined the sense of responsibility and the prayers she must have prayed on that day as she led her own little 10-year-old daughter to the Lord. Very soon afterward, I was baptized at First Baptist Church.

One summer I was on the staff of Glorietta Baptist Assembly near Santa Fe. Another summer I worked as a Summer Missionary under the auspices of the Southern Baptist Home Mission Board in North and South Dakota, helping small congregations hold Vacation Bible Schools.

Bill and I met in the College Department at Second Baptist Church in Lubbock. We got married in 1962 even though we both had another year to go before graduating from Tech. As a psychology major, Bill



knew he would have to go on to graduate school. So after I graduated, I got my first teaching job in Abernathy, Texas, and Bill commuted to Tech to begin working on his PhD. In the end, I received my PhT degree – Putting Hubby Through.

Daughters Crystal Dawn and Amy Rene came along and I taught remedial reading at home. During my 35-year teaching career, I taught choral music, orchestra, English, reading, remedial reading, self-contained special education, English as a Second Language, and served as junior high librarian.

Dr. Bill Erwin

I was born in Gould, Oklahoma on a cold January 4, 1940. My family moved to Amarillo in 1942. On May 31, 1958, I graduated from Amarillo High School. While I was a student at Texas Tech, I married Janis Richardson on September 8, 1962.

I accepted Christ into my life during an Angel Martinez revival in Amarillo during the summer of 1957. At that time I was attending Tascosa Baptist Church.

When I was going to Tech, I joined Second Baptist Church, where I met Janis in the College Department. Janis and I continued our membership there until we moved to Louisville, Kentucky, where I completed my doctoral internship at the University of Louisville Medical School. While in Louisville we attended Walnut Avenue Baptist Church and Crescent Hill Baptist Church. Our daughter Crystal was born in Louisville. After the year in Louisville, I accepted a job at TCU where we attended University Baptist from 1969 until 1971.

In 1971 I graduated from Tech with a Doctor of Philosophy Degree. We moved to Amarillo where I was on the faculty at West Texas University in Canyon from 1971 until 1979. In Amarillo we found that the Baptist church no longer suited us. At that time we joined First Christian Church, partly because of the wonderful children's program there. Our daughter Amy was born in 1973. I became licensed as a psychologist in the state of Texas and began a private practice that has lasted fifty-one years.

We moved back to Lubbock and then two years later we made our last move – to San Antonio at the behest of a former colleague who wanted me to practice with his group. At that time, Alamo Heights Christian Church was between pastors. We waited until Bill Smythe became pastor and joined. Our girls grew up in a church that nurtured them and helped them to become caring individuals.
